CURRENT VISITOR POLICY

- Visitors should arrive wearing a mask and MUST continue wearing one while in our facilities
- DO NOT visit if you are sick
- No visitation for COVID-19 positive patients
- Staff may restrict visitation in areas with limited space
- All visitors must be 18 years of age or older

Adult Inpatient Visitation

Two (2) designated visitor per day from 12 p.m. - 7 p.m. Monday - Friday (no admittance after 6 p.m.) and 12 p.m. - 5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday (no admittance after 4 p.m.)

All visitors must use the Main Entrance (exiting through Emergency Department Entrance after 6 p.m. weekdays and 4 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday)

Visitors are asked to remain in the patient room during their visit

Pediatric Inpatient Visitation

Pediatric patients will be permitted to have two (2) parent/guardian at bedside for the duration of their stay (Parent/Guardian will follow all Inpatient Visitation guidelines as outlined above.)

No additional visitors will be permitted outside of the identified parent/guardian



Emergency Department

Two (2) visitors will be allowed per patient at bedside

Visitors must enter and exit through Emergency Department entrance

All visitors will be required to stay in the patient's room and are asked to exit the building after visit

Surgical Patient Visitation

One (1) visitor may accompany patient for outpatient surgical procedures

All visitors will be required to stay in designated waiting area

Visitors are permitted to leave and return following surgery

Diagnostic Testing at Hospital

Adult patients are asked to come unaccompanied for diagnostic testing

However, one (1) person is permitted to accompany adult patient requiring cognitive or physical assistance

One (1) parent/guardian will be allowed to accompany pediatric patients

Outpatient Diagnostic Center

Adult patients are asked to come unaccompanied for diagnostic testing

Adult patient requiring cognitive or physical assistance will one (1) visitor be allowed to enter

One (1) parent/guardian will be allowed per pediatric patient

Primary & Specialty Care Offices

Adult patients are asked to come unaccompanied for diagnostic testing

However, one (1) person is permitted to accompany adult patient requiring cognitive or physical assistance

One (1) parent/guardian will be allowed to accompany pediatric patients
